Imports not in compliance or not appropriately identified or packaged and labelled in accordance with the import conditions they represent may be subject to seizure, treatment, re-export or destruction at the importer's expense.
 Additionally, all foods imported into Australia must comply with the provisions of the *Imported Food Control Act 1992*, and may be inspected and/or analysed against the requirements of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code.
 All imports containing or derived from Genetically Modified material must comply with the *Gene Technology Act 2000*.

It is the importer's responsibility to identify, and to ensure it has complied with, all requirements of any other regulatory organisations and advisory bodies prior to and after importation including The Australian Customs Service, The Department of Health and Ageing, Therapeutic Goods Administration, Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority, Department of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts, Food Standards Australia New Zealand and any state agencies such as Departments of Agriculture and Health and Environmental Protection authorities. Importers should note that this list is not exhaustive.

Import conditions are subject to change at the discretion of the Director of Quarantine. This permit may be revoked without notice.



Notification of the import must be provided to AQIS for all imported goods other than goods imported as accompanied baggage or goods imported via the mail and not prescribed under the *Customs Act 1901*. Notification must be consistent with *Quarantine Regulations 2000* (examples include a Quarantine Entry or a Quarantine declaration).

The importer must contact the AQIS regional office in the port of entry to confirm:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> the estimated time of arrival of each shipment; and all arrangements for inspections with AQIS. <p>3. The importer is responsible for payment of all incurred AQIS fees and charges.</p> <p>4. The consignment must be accompanied by a signed manufacturer's declaration from Unigen Inc, 2660 Willamette Dr, NE, Lacey, WA 98516, United States of America stating:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • That the only ingredients of plant origin in this product are extracts of <i>Scutellaria baicalensis</i>, <i>Acacia catechu</i> and maltodextrin. • That this product contains no meat meal or meat and bone meal, or other material derived from animals or birds. • That this product contains no whole seeds, or viable plant material. • The manufacturing facility does not store or use any animal proteins or fats on site. • The product is packaged in new, clean packaging. • That this product has been protected from post-processing contamination. <p>All Manufacturer's Declarations must be:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> From the company that manufactured the goods. On manufacturer's letterhead (including company address and country). Written in English, legible, and containing the correct statement/s as required on this Import Permit. Signed by a senior company employee from the site of manufacture whose name, title and contact details also appear. Issued and dated within the last 6 months (unless otherwise specified in this Import Permit). Free from erasures and non-certified alterations (all erasures and alterations must be endorsed by the issuer of the document. The only acceptable endorsement is a company stamp or seal and the signature of the person responsible for signing the declaration applied adjacent to the alteration). Specific to the relevant commodity listed on this Import Permit. Have a unique identifiable link to the consignment by referring to at least one of the following: container number, bill of lading number, commercial invoice number, preferential tariff certificate number, packing list number, letter of credit number, batch/serial number or date of manufacture. <p>5. Each shipment must be free of soil, live insects, disease symptoms, prohibited seeds, other plant material (e.g. leaf, stem material, fruit pulp, pod material, etc), animal material (e.g. animal faeces, feathers, etc) and any other extraneous contamination of quarantine concern.</p> <p>6. Product must be packed in new, clean packaging.</p> <p>7. Full Container Load (FCL) consignments must meet the following requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Timber packaging, pallets, or dunnage in full container loads (FCL) will be subject to inspection and treatment on arrival, unless certified as having been treated by an AQIS-approved method. The consignment must be accompanied by a packer's declaration stating that all container/s prior to loading were in sound condition and have been thoroughly cleaned of all contamination with imported and/or local whole grain, insect pests, and other infestable residue, soil, animal remains, faeces or any other extraneous contamination. <p>8. In order to facilitate clearance, airfreight or mail shipments should have all documentation securely attached to the outside of the package, and clearly marked 'Attention Quarantine'. Documentation may include permit (or permit number), invoice, manufacturer's declarations and certification where applicable. Alternatively, necessary documentation will need to be presented to</p>

All documentation must be presented to AQIS for examination upon arrival. <u>NOTE:</u> All documentation must meet the requirements of the “Minimum Documentary Requirements Policy”.</p> <p>Quarantine Procedures</p> <p>10. All consignments meeting the above conditions must be forwarded to a metropolitan Quarantine Approved Premises for either:</p> <p>i) A full unpack and inspection; OR ii) A partial unpack and inspection (or full unpack as required) under AQIS supervision. The quantity to be unpacked is at the discretion of the Quarantine officer and should be sufficient to ascertain that the conditions of import have been met.</p> <p>11. Each consignment must be inspected by the Quarantine officer to confirm:</p> <p>a) product is packaged in clean and new packaging; b) the product’s packaging is in sound condition; and c) freedom from live insects, soil, disease symptoms, prohibited seeds, other plant material (e.g. leaf, stem material, fruit pulp, pod material, etc.), animal material (e.g. animal faeces, feathers, etc.) and any other extraneous contamination of quarantine concern.</p> <p>12. Consignments meeting the above conditions may be released from quarantine by the Quarantine officer.</p> <p>13. If the product is not packaged in clean new packaging or the integrity of the packaging is found to be deficient, the consignment will require testing for ruminant DNA, in accordance with the following procedure:</p> <p>i) The Quarantine officer is to take a total of 500gms from each consignment. The sampling requires the collecting of 100gms from 5 separate sites from the consignment that is being inspected. This sample is to be forwarded by the Quarantine officer for analysis at the National Measurement Institute (NMI). The importer is responsible for organising and paying for courier transport directly from AQIS to NMI although the sample is to remain in AQIS control until obtained by the courier. All costs associated with testing are at the importer's expense. ii) The remainder of the consignment is to be held under quarantine at a Quarantine Approved Premise at the importer's expense until confirmation of the testing has been received by AQIS. Release will be approved on a consignment basis upon receipt of a declaration from NMI stating that the batch is free of ruminant DNA. iii) Details of all consignments requiring DNA testing (including permit number and Quarantine Entry) should be forwarded to the Plant Quarantine Program – Canberra office.</p>
